Public Comment:

Vivian Conner reported GLIB budget assessment, summary of recommendation for Wake Boat effects per Fisheries Report 37 (copy of report on file).

Deb Masselink reported GLPA ceased use of copper-based algaecides.

Clerk Risner to post Fisheries Report 37 recommendations on website and township fb page once GLPA & GLIB have notified her of their review.

Rebecca Abbott reported OCO Golf Outing and Orangeville Baptist Church Community Picnic were held.

New Business:

Supervisor Rook summarized information meeting with BCRC regarding gravel trucks on township roads. Basically, township has few options. BCRC can bill gravel company for documented damage done to roads based on longevity of road condition per normal uses. BCRC will look into reduced truck speed limit on Keller Rd.

Gary Godley application for marina discussed. Audience members stated opposition and possible actions to report to EGLE if illegal operations are occurring prior to EGLE determination. Clerk Risner stated this is all in preliminary stage, per Barry County Planning & Zoning a special use permit must be granted first and he has not acted on that at this time. Supervisor Rook stated, reasons will need to be given as to why opposed, (such as destruction of protected wetlands, parking issues, dredging lake bottom with boat motors, etc.) can't just say we don't want it. Jim McManus recommended board and public comment when notices are received from EGLE and Planning & Zoning hearing on this matter. Trustee Ribble to email Planning & Zoning documentation (picture) of violation already occurring and request they take action.

Old Business:

Regarding Young Family Cemetery, Clerk Risner received letter from attorney stating township would have to move bodies with headstones. Because of age of Young Family Cemetery (100 + years) would need court order. Attorney also stated property owner may not have legal rights regarding these burial sites. Township will not pursue matter further.
